Please:

1. Copy this flyer and give it to each of your scouts and to your adult committee.
2. Inform your scouts that they **MUST** call the counselor immediately after they have read the requirements in the merit badge pamphlet of their choice. Counselors have the right to refuse admission to any scout who has not called and prepared properly.
3. Furnish your scouts with a blue merit badge application card (the blue application paper form is fine). They must bring this card to Merit Badge Day filled out and signed by you.
4. Make sure your scouts are prepared for the merit badges before coming to Merit Badge Day.
5. Remind your scouts to wear their **FULL UNIFORM** to Merit Badge Day, as this is **required**.

SCOUTS, in order to have a smooth running, successful day for you, we need your help! **PLEASE:**

1. Choose a merit badge from the available classes. Make note of classes that take two sessions
2. Read the **MOST RECENT** edition pamphlet of the merit badge(s) of your choice then: **CALL THE COUNSELOR IMMEDIATELY!** There are requirements for each merit badge that **must** be completed by you **before** Merit Badge Day. Ask the counselor questions about prerequisites and any equipment, notebooks, pens or pencils, etc. you need to bring.
3. **Do the prerequisites and bring the pamphlet** (Merit Badge book) with you to Merit Badge Day.
4. **Bring a Merit Badge Application Card (or blue application paper form is OK) signed by your Scoutmaster. General rule is no signature on the blue card, no admittance into the class.**
5. You **MUST BE IN FULL UNIFORM OR YOU WILL NOT BE ALLOWED IN CLASS.**
6. Bring a sack lunch or \$3.00 each to buy your lunch (see announcement below).
7. Bring change for a phone call if you need to make one.
8. Remember: Classes close after the first 15 minutes

2. a. Give a short biographical sketch of any **TWO** of the following:
Daniel Carter Beard; William D. Boyce; Waite Phillips; Ernest Thompson Seton; James E. West.
4. Do ONE of the following:
 - a. Attend either a BSA national jamboree, OR a national BSA high-adventure base. While there, keep a journal documenting your experiences. Report to your counselor.
 - b. **Write or visit the National Scouting Museum in Irving, Texas.** Give a short report. (NOTE: If, in 2010, you visited the BSA's National Traveling Tour: Adventure Base 100, you may use this experience to fulfill 4-b).
5. Learn about the history of your unit or Scouting in your area. Interview at least two people (one from the PAST and one from the PRESENT) associated with your troop. Find out when your unit was originally chartered. Create a REPORT of your findings on the history of your troop, and PRESENT it to your patrol or troop or at a court of honor. This presentation could be in many forms. Note: Plan to re-give your presentation at Merit Badge Day!
6. Make a collection of some of your personal patches and other Scouting memorabilia.... Show this collection to your counselor.
8. Interview at least three men (different from those in #5) over the age of 50 who were Scouts. Find out about their experiences and the impact Scouting had on their lives. (Take notes). Share what you learned with your counselor.

Gardening

Merit Badge Prerequisites for (OCTOBER 1st) for GARDENING:

One-A & B Grow six vegetables and six flowers (three from seeds and three from seedlings), through harvesting/flowering. *Suggestion: Plant more than required as some WILL DIE. Make a log of your plantings, and take pictures of the results.*

Three Test 100 seeds for germination. *Suggestion: Plant 100 grass seeds in a container. Bring it in, or bring a picture. Count the sprouts of grass after approximately three weeks.*

Four Visit a nursery. Report on what you learned. *Suggestion: Make this visit when you are buying your seeds and seedlings!*

Six- A, B, C, or D Build and maintain for 90 days: a compost bin; or a vermipost bin; or a hydroponic garden; or a water garden. *Take pictures. (Do before July 4th!)*

Read the GARDENING Merit Badge pamphlet. If you have questions, call Arline to discuss this future badge.

PLEASE NOTE: CAMOUFLAGE, SWEATS AND T-SHIRTS ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE AND YOU WILL BE SENT HOME. COMPLETE UNIFORMS ONLY.
